"Confirmation" can be divided into two things: the **Rite of Confirmation** and the **Confirmation Class**.

The Rite (or ceremony, special event) **of Confirmation** is the time when someone stands up and confesses their Christian faith in _ _ _ _ .

 "Confirmation is a public rite of the church preceded by a period of instruction designed to help baptized Christians identify with the life and mission of the Christian community... The rite of confirmation provides an opportunity for the individual Christian, relying on God's promise given in Holy Baptism, to make a personal public confession of the faith and a lifelong pledge of fidelity to Christ."

The Confirmation Class is the years or weeks of classes where people are specifically taught about the Christian faith. This is also known as *catechesis*.
